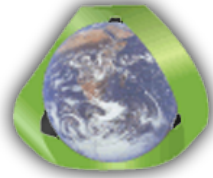

The WTER Awards consist of the WTER Statuette and a stipend to the Nominators of the winning Cities to attend the WTER meeting in New York City, make a presentation on the waste management system of their Nominee City, and receive the 2010 WTER Awards at the WTER/SUR Awards Dinner of October 7, 2010.

An article will be published in a prestigious journal describing the attributes of all cities nominated to these Awards. Earlier WTER Award winners included Martin GmbH of Germany, Prof. George Tchobanoglous of UC-Davis, U.S.A., Prof. Paul Brunner of Technical University of Vienna, Austria, and the Brescia, Italy WTE facility.
